NPs: Better Health Access for Our Nation's Seniors


Today's seniors are taking a more active role in their health care and are looking for health care providers who will help them achieve their personal health goals. As clinicians who blend clinical expertise in diagnosing and treating health conditions with an emphasis on disease prevention and health management, nurse practitioners (NPs) are increasingly meeting that need.

A need that is increasing. America's population is aging, and by 2030, approximately 80 million seniors will be Medicare beneficiaries. America's seniors are also experiencing more of chronic disease. By 2030, 4 in 10 seniors are predicted to be diagnosed with heart disease or diabetes.1

NPs play a critical role in ensuring high-quality health care access for aging adults. NPs provide in-demand health care services to seniors across a wide range of settings, from primary care practices to hospitals, long-term care, telehealth, and in patients' homes.
